Fulfillment of the Professional Doctorate includes postgraduate course work and a research dissertation. Applicants must have a veterinary degree registrable in New South Wales, Australia, a minimum of 2 years experience in domestic animal practice and be a resident of Australia, or a New Zealand citizen. Applicants should have a logical and evidence-based approach to clinical case investigations, a strong academic background, and strong written and verbal communication skills. They should also demonstrate good time-management skills, have the ability to work well in a team and a strong commitment to the fields of zoo, wildlife and conservation medicine.
